

\$55,250 for LWML-NED Mission Projects. \$21,250 for national LWML Mission Projects; and \$8,500 for Lutheran Women's Missionary League-New England District Administration

7b PEER FELLOWS PILOT PROGRAM – First Lutheran Church of Boston

\$5,000

The goal of the *peer fellows* is to meet students where they are, on campuses, and have a dependable presence on campuses to bring the Gospel to those who would not otherwise hear it. They will foster relationships with students through the Word and be able to



encourage further teaching or attendance at Divine Services. They will be trained and discipled by First Lutheran Church's (FLC) director of young adult ministry and encouraged for ongoing ministry and leadership within the church. Funds will be used for the Peer Fellows stipends of \$300/month. Once the program has proved effective, a donor will support the program.

CRANT 7A, Ministry of Early Childhood, Immanuel Lutheran School, Bristol, CT has been FULLY FUNDED (\$5,000).

As you plan to travel by plane to the Lutheran Women in Mission Convention in Omaha, Nebraska, this June, we want to help ensure your travel goes smoothly! **Starting May 7**, the U.S. Transportation Administration (TSA) will require all travelers to present either a REAL-ID compliant U.S. driver's license or a valid passport to board their flight.


Spring Rally April 26, 2025
