## 7b PEER FELLOWS PILOT PROGRAM – First Lutheran Church of Boston

\$5,000

The goal of the peer fellows is to meet students where they are, on campuses, and have a dependable presence on campuses to bring the Gospel to those who would not otherwise hear it. They will foster relationships with students through the Word and be able to



encourage further teaching or attendance at Divine Services. They will be trained and discipled by First Lutheran Church's (FLC) director of young adult ministry and encouraged for ongoing ministry and leadership within the church. Funds will be used for the Peer Fellows stipends of \$300/month. Once the program has proved effective, a donor will support the program.

Regional Disaster Response LERT Shower Trailers — LCMS Office of National Mission, Disaster Response Ministry, U.S. \$81,500



Lutheran Early Response Team training events and resources are available for congregations and members of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) to serve their neighbors in times of need following a disaster.

Lutheran Early Response Teams (LERT) serve thousands of individuals and families who are suffering from loss in the wake of disasters like hurricanes, floods, earthquakes, fires, and tornadoes. When deployed, LERT teams traditionally use congregations in the disaster areas as their base camps. The host congregations provide a place for the LERT teams to sleep, eat, rest, recover, and receive spiritual care during their time of service. Host congregations are incredible to work with as the teams help them rebuild their communities and share the lifechanging message of the Gospel. One challenge for team members has been the lack of showers and laundry facilities at a

host church. LERT members have showered at national gym chains, in members' homes, in personal campers, or even under cold garden hoses. This grant will fund half the cost of two combination bathroom/shower/laundry trailers to be used during disaster response work.

Looking at this picture you can almost "feel" this working day at convention. There was nothing like seeing a room of almost 4,000 Lutheran women singing together, enjoying, and connecting. The 2025 Lutheran Women in Mission Convention, gracious hearts united to support four



vital offerings. The first offering raised \$61,056.85 for the 2025-2027 LWML Mission Goal, supporting mission grants that further the spread of the Gospel and service around the world. The **second** offering collected \$45,934.92 to aid Camp Linn Haven and Mountainside Lutheran Church in Newland. North Carolina, as they recover from over \$2 million in damage caused by Hurricane Helene. The third offering provided \$35,251.15 to the Grace Point Institute for Relational Help, supporting pastoral care and counseling services for church workers across Nebraska. The **fourth** 

offering garnered \$36,866.88 for the Lutheran Early Response Team (LERT) in the Oklahoma District, helping fund essential equipment for disaster relief and debris removal.
