Dear Sisters in Mission:

Have you ever been on a trip that you enjoyed but you felt ready to go home? Maybe the trip was just too long, the culture was so very different, the weather was too extreme, or the trip was physically exhausting. Don't we often feel that way about our journey through this life? The apostle Paul did. *My desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better* (Philippians 1:23b). As we travel through this life, we face many trials, but the Word of God comforts us as it reminds us that this world is not our true home as our citizenship is in heaven (Philippians 3:20a).

The great chapter on faith, Hebrews 11, gives us the example of Abraham. He obeyed God's call to leave his home, and he trusted in God even though he had no idea where God was leading him. Abraham lived a nomadic life in tents looking forward to the heavenly home God was preparing for him. For he was looking forward to the city that has foundations, whose designer and builder is God. They desire a better country, that is a heavenly one. Therefore, God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared for them a city (Hebrews 11:10,16).

With heaven as our home, we are strangers and exiles on the earth seeking a homeland (Hebrews 11:13b,14b). Is it any surprise then that we often feel that we don't fit in with the culture of this world? The Christians of the first century certainly didn't fit in with the culture and religion of the Roman Empire. Peter, writing to Jewish and Gentile Christians who were suffering persecution for their faith, calls them sojourners and exiles (1 Peter 2:11).

The hymn, I'm But a Stranger Here," beautifully expresses that as God's children, our home is in heaven, and our journey as pilgrims in this life is short. The "tempests that rage" and "time's wild wintry blasts" in this life "soon shall be overpast," and we shall return to our true home through faith in Christ who reconciled us to the Father through His death and resurrection.

LWML District 2022-2024 Mission Grant #4



4 Brazilian - Portuguese Language Outreach—Messiah Lutheran Church, Lynnfield, MA----\$5,000

The purpose of this project is to help Messiah Lutheran Church share the Gospel with the Portuguese speaking population in their area. First generation Brazilian immigrants need resources for spiritual growth in their native language, and Messiah needs help in communicating with them. They currently have several families connected to the church that would benefit from Portuguese language resources, and they believe

that if they can provide Bible Studies and fellowship opportunities in Portuguese that number will grow. This grant will provide Portuguese Bibles and catechisms, food and supplies to host fellowship gatherings, and a Portuguese speaking LCMS pastor to lead regular Bible Study in Portuguese over Zoom.

About This Mission Grant



Alexandria Shick is a third-year Concordia Seminary deaconess student currently serving her internship at St. Luke's Lutheran Church & School in Oviedo, Fla. She plans to serve in correctional chaplaincy after graduation.

Deaconesses are continually pointing those they serve toward the cross, sharing the Gospel with them so they gain the wonderful gift of eternal life through faith in our Lord Jesus Christ. Concordia Seminary has requested, through this mission grant, much-needed scholarships for deaconess students and assistance with seminary costs to provide high-quality theological education. Enrollment in the new online Deaconess Studies Program is expected to increase, enabling the faculty to form more well-trained deaconesses and bring more people to Jesus and provide compassionate, Christ-centered help to those who are hurting and suffering — physically, emotionally, and spiritually.
