






Counselor's Corner by Rev. Kevin Mongeau, Junior Counselor

I had the honor of attending the LWML 41st Biennium Convention in Omaha, Nebraska, this year. I have to tell you, it was amazing!

I had many conversations with different men and women from all over. They asked if I had ever been to a national





Psalm 66:1-5 says, "Shout for joy to God, all the earth; sing the glory of his name; give to him glorious praise! Say to God, how awesome are your deeds! So great is your power that your enemies come cringing to you. All the earth worships you and sings praises to you; they sing praises to your name. Come and see what God has done: he is awesome in his deeds toward the children of man." This is really what the convention did for me. It made me shout for joy.

The Lord knew way before I did that I would need to go to this convention. He knows me inside and out and He knew that I really needed this inspiration. There are times when we all need a boost. Satan is good at what he does as he causes doubt and continually tries to push a wedge between us and God. 
It's always Doxology time from Gospel Outreach!

During the 4-day V.B.S. program, we focused on the Lord's promise that Jesus gives us everything, desires for us to commit to follow him, helps us overcome obstacles and to show others the way. About 30 children attended each day with bible stories, games and crafts, gathering with their families over a meal at the end of each day. The team focused on building relationships, listening and encouraging the children to be all that the Lord has made them to be, while being mindful of sorrows and challenges of life on the reservation. Supporting, even for a brief period, the efforts of Pastor Tim, Heidi and their children in this trying mission field was a blessing.

We also helped with improvements to the church property, such as roof repairs, poured a concrete ramp to remedy a tripping hazard at the main entrance, stained an arbor used for outdoor services, replaced some rotten window trim and removed old carpeting.

Please pray for Elizabeth, Joseph, Sasha, Verno, Ava, Sam, Stormi, Jayrose, Paiden, Desby, Rafael—these are but a few of God's children that we shared time with.



Lutheran Women in Mission Sunday 2025

Traditionally celebrated the first Sunday in October, Lutheran Women in Mission Sunday can be celebrated any time.



This year's theme begins a four-year cycle focusing on the LWML Mission Statement — As Lutheran Women in Mission, we joyfully proclaim Christ, support missions, and equip women to honor God by serving others. For Lutheran Women in Mission Sunday 2025 we focus on Proclaiming Christ.

Everything we do as Lutheran Women in Mission begins with Christ's message of repentance and forgiveness. The Ascension text of "GO" (Luke 24:44–53) is the mission emphasis for Lutheran Women in Mission Sunday 2025. On Ascension Day, Jesus gave his followers an assignment "that repentance and forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name to all nations." We, as the church of the Lord Jesus Christ, have a responsibility to proclaim the message of Christ, to be that body which proclaims repentance and forgiveness, showing forth the merciful Christ in what we do and say. As Lutheran Women in Mission we continue to support, encourage and uplift missionaries, and also provide physical support and compassion to all people. It is the proclamation of repentance and forgiveness of sins in Jesus' name that motivates us to do this work. All Glory be to Jesus!
